Activity 3 Improve condition of Public Right of Ways as part of the Green Capital Project.	 G.C organising site visit along Avon Trail towpath G.C monitoring Strawberry Lane to ensure lighting columns are effective and cut back by landowners. As reports are received PROWs that need additional resource could be cleared if necessary by Community Payback as bird nesting ended.
Activity 4 Develop 2 programme of activities to tackle dog fouling.	 G.C and Street Scene Enforcement team running an Autumn Dog Fouling and Tidy Friday/Tuesday campaign working with schools. Invited all St George primary schools to take part, focusing on hotspots from our database of dog fouling reports. Awareness raising and Enforcement will take place between October and December 2016. 2nd programme will follow in Spring 2016/7.
