- study for a project to help reduce Bristol's carbon emissions. This study was completed in June and the project proposals set out in this paper were developed from the findings of that study.6. The project has been developed in close collaboration with partners and will be delivered working closely with
- those partners and Bristol City Leap partnership.

Cabinet Member / Officer Recommendations:

That Cabinet:

- 1. Note that Bristol City Council has been successful in joining the Innovate UK Net Zero Pathfinder Places Programme and that Bristol City Council has delivered a successful Phase 1 feasibility study into the acceleration of action towards achieving carbon neutrality in the city.
- 2. Authorise the Executive Director Growth and Regeneration in consultation with the Cabinet Member for Climate, Ecology, Energy and Waste to take all steps required to submit a bid to Innovate UK's Net Zero Living Programme Pathfinder Places competition Phase 2 Strand 1 'Pathfinder Demonstrator' of up to £5m deliver a Demonstrator Project to contribute to the achievement of council and city climate goals.
- 3. Note that a further report will be brought to Cabinet to seek approval for the main delivery phase of the Pathfinder Demonstrator Project if the bid is successful with some preparatory work taking place ahead of that.

Corporate Strategy alignment:

1. The project is focused on achieving the priority of ENV1 Carbon Neutral but contributes to a range of priorities.

City Benefits:

1. The project aims to reduce the city's carbon emissions, reduce fuel poverty and increase jobs and training in the net zero supply chain, particularly in the building retrofit field in the context of a just transition.

Consultation Details

- 1. The project has been developed in dialogue with partners, the Bristol Green Capital Partnership and Bristol and Bath Regional Capital. In phase 1, BCC has engaged with several community organisations.
- 2. The phase 2 project would involve very substantial public and stakeholder consultation over the next 2 years.

Required information to be completed by Financial/Legal/ICT/ HR partners:

1. Finance Advice:

This report seeks Cabinet approval to submit a bid for up to £5m of funding to Innovate UK's Net Zero Living Programme Pathfinder Places Competition Phase 2. This will follow upon the successful completion of the feasibility study conducted within Phase 1 of the same competition.

If successful, the money received will fund a range of activities in conjunction with several partners which are designed to contribute to the achievement of Bristol City Council's and the city's climate goals.

Costing

The service has undertaken a detailed costing exercise to calculate the funding requirement. This is summarised in the table below. This funder does not allow for inflation or contingencies to be added to its bids. However, the service has ensured that those areas that are susceptible to price increases or other risks that may inflate costs are priced accordingly and conservatively.

These are indicative costs as the fine detail remains under discussion until bid submission.

Funding

These revenue costs are expected to be funded in full using a revenue grant to be provided by Innovate UK.

There is no requirement to match fund and therefore this proposed activity will not require any funding from the council's approved revenue or capital budgets. If the bid is successful, the council will be required to deliver the expected outputs and will ensure that this responsibility and risk is shared with or transferred to all delivery partners as appropriate.

A further report will be presented to Cabinet should this bid be successful.
