

## Committee Model Working Group – Terms of Reference 22/23

#### Context

- 1. On 5 May 2022 a governance referendum was held to determine whether Bristol City Council should be run by a Mayor who is elected by voters or by one or more committees made up of elected Councillors.
- 2. The outcome of the governance referendum will lead to a change in the way that the Council is run from the current Directly Elected Mayor model of governance to a committee model of governance, with effect from the third day after the date of local elections in 2024.
- 3. At an extraordinary meeting of the Full Council on 24<sup>th</sup> May 22, Members agreed to establish a Cross-Party Working Group to develop the committee model of governance.
- 4. The Cross Party Working Group will have monthly meetings in public with effect from January 2023.

#### Purpose

- 5. The Working Group will be responsible for developing the design principles for the structure of the committee model and making recommendations to Full Council, which will include details of proposed changes to the Constitution This will include consideration of the following themes:
- Leadership, functions, roles and structure of Committees
- Potential role of scrutiny
- Officer support and structure
- Briefings and agenda setting procedures
- Public engagement under the Committee Model
- Equality, Diversity and Accessibility
- Local decision making
- Delegations to officers
- Working under the Committee Model in a Council with 'no overall control'
- Engagement with external partners
- New governance arrangements to be kept under review
- Enabling public engagement is a key objective of the Working Group. This will include seeking views during the design phase (for example through public events), as well as ensuring that the committee model will support democratic decision making. A number of events have taken place in 2022, with additional activities planned for 2023/24.
